

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



# VOLTAGE GAIN TEST CIRCUIT




# NOISE VOLTAGE TEST CIRCUIT





DERATING FACTOR OF POWER DISSIPATION




GATE TO SOURCE CURRENT vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE

les - Gate to Source Current - μA




VGS - Gate to Source Voltage - V




#### INPUT CAPACITANCE vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE


DRAIN CURRENT vs. DRAIN TO SOURCE VOLTAGE





DRAIN CURRENT vs. GATE TO SOURCE VOLTAGE


